- Foundation the School's Governing Body is responsible for deciding the admission arrangements for pupils






Types of Schools







Admission Criteria

- Rules used to decide which children are offered places when there
 are more applications than places available.
- Rules may differ between local authorities and types of schools.
- Check school and local authority websites in case there are any changes to the information in LA booklets



Community School Admission Criteria (summary - see booklet for full details)

- children in public care or previously adopted
- children for whom a particular school is appropriate on exceptional medical grounds
- children with a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission (living at the same address)
- children of members of staff
- children living nearest to the school measured as the "crow flies"



Exceptions

- Chace Community priority zone for nominated roads
- Enfield County School for Girls has a quota system of allocation

Partially or Fully Selective Schools

- Selective schools will test children before the closing date for applications.
- Children must be registered directly with the schools to be entered for the relevant selective tests/trials/auditions
- Schools will let parents have the results of the tests/trial/audition before the closing date for the Borough application (subject to any COVID restrictions).



Partially or Fully Selective Schools

- If results are not available before 31st October closing date, you will still need to include the school in your application
- If, after receiving information about the outcome of the test, you want to change your preferred schools, you should make this request as soon as possible and no later than 8th December.

PLEASE CHECK ALL SCHOOLS CAREFULLY FOR UP TO DATE INFORMATION

Medical criteria

- You must provide information about any medical issues about your child that you would like considered in relation to your application.
- Very few children are given priority under this criterion as schools can generally meet the needs of the majority of children.
- There is a form on the Enfield website (or other local authorities) that you should use when applying under the medical criterion.
- The information you give must state why one particular school/s is more able to meet your child's needs than another. (Some schools do not have a medical criterion.)
- You can provide supporting evidence from professionals
- Medical circumstances of parents are not considered.



What can Enfield parents expect?

- one local authority application for all maintained schools (community, foundation, voluntary aided, free school and academy) regardless of where the school is located
- common closing date across England for the submission of forms – 31st October 2021
- 6 preferences across London (Hertfordshire will only accept four Hertfordshire schools – don't include more)
- equal consideration given to each school asked for



What can Enfield parents expect?

- We will apply for schools outside the area on your behalf.
- We can only accept late applications or changes of preference after the deadline in exceptional circumstances
- If your child is eligible for more than one school, the preference order will be used to decide the final offer
- Single offer emailed on 1st March 2022

On Line Applications

- It is quick and easy to do just register and follow the instructions
- You will get an email confirmation once you submit your application
- The online system checks that you are completing all the right sections of the application
- The online system is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week until midnight on the closing date
 - You can get your result on the evening of 1 March 2022 and either accept and decline your offer on line



Making your application

Make sure you tell us...

- If the child is looked after or adopted?
- Are there brothers or sisters attending any of the schools applied for?
- Does a parent work at any of the schools listed on your form?



Making your application

- Provide supporting information with your application if you are asking for medical priority
- Be sure the address you use is the child's usual place of residence. Attach details if not
- Include your council tax reference number in your application.
- Complete any supplementary forms and send them directly to the schools
- Meet all the deadlines



School Preferences

- You must indicate your true order of preference. This information is not given to any of the Secondary Schools.
- It is 'unlawful' to operate a 'first preference first' system.
- You will not be able to change your preferences after 31st October unless there are very exceptional circumstances.
- If you change address after the deadline or change primary school you can complete a form to submit to Admissions.



How schools are allocated

- Each school you list is considered at the same time, including schools in other local authorities.
- The published admissions criteria are applied to every school you list.
- The computer system works out who can be offered a place at the schools.
- Each school has a set number of places (published admission number) and places are offered until they are full.
- If a child can be offered more than one place they will be offered the highest possible preference on the list.

What happens if you are not offered any of your preferred schools?

- Sometimes you are not offered any school you have listed because other applicants met the admissions criteria better, e.g. other applicants lived closer to the school.
- If this happens you will be offered a place at the nearest school with an available place.

Offers and Waiting Lists

- You will be sent an email with the outcome of your application after 7pm on the evening of 1 March 2022. You will be directed to the on-line website to view your offer letter.
- Waiting list information and information about appealing are included in your letters.
- You will automatically be put on the waiting list for schools with a higher preference on your list.
- You should accept your offer by 16th March. Accepting the offer will not affect your waiting list position or appeal outcome.

Distances for out of borough schools (2021)

- The furthest distance the LA offered places for admission in March 2020 – national offer day. Places are offered after March if there is 'movement'.
- Ashmole 0.555 (about the same as last year)
- Alexandra Park 0.43 (about the same as last year)
- Friern Barnet 4.897 (less than last year distance is further than other schools due to some applicants being selected for performing arts)
- Compton 0.734 (about the same as last year)
- East Barnet 1.909 (slightly further than last year)
- Heartlands 0.9472 (slightly less than last year)
- St Andrew the Apostle 4.891 (VA school)


Distances

- The vast majority of school places are offered under the distance criterion. Distances are measured in a straight line from the Ordnance Survey address point of the child's home address to the Ordnance Survey address point of the school, using a computerized mapping system. Where applicants have identical distance (to thousandths of a mile) priority will be determined at random.
- Local authorities can tell you your distance to a particular school but if you want to get a rough idea you can use:

Things to remember...



- Find out more about all the schools you are interested in, especially those in your local area.
- Check out school websites for up to date information about opportunities to visit – open evenings are planned but schools may have to make changes at short notice.
- Look at the pattern of admissions in previous years and criteria.
- Distance counts for many schools and will often be a deciding factor if there are more applications than places available.

Things to remember

- If you are considering schools outside Enfield, look at other authority websites for details
- Check if you need to complete a supplementary information form
- Complete all applications in full



Things to remember

- Make an informed decision. Consider first hand, accurate and up to date information
- Speak to your child's primary school
- Be realistic.
- Admissions will check with the school the child's home address at the time of admission.
 If fraud is suspected Admissions will investigate.



Main residence

What is a 'main residence'?

This is your child's only or main residence on the closing date of application. This is the place where your child sleeps and spends most of their time, Monday to Friday. This cannot be a temporary address, business address, childminder's address, family member address.

If you own a property but are living at and apply from a different address, the council will consider that the second address is temporary and that the property you own is where your child normally lives.

If parents are separated the application should be made by the parent the child normally lives with. Where a child spends equal time during the school week with each parent.

A future 'intended' address will not be accepted.



MYTH BUSTER

If I apply to a school in another borough, their residents will have priority over me.

I have an older child already at the school so I don't need to apply.

All my friends are going to the school I want so I should be able to go.

I have a right to be given a school of our choice.

Children in my road go to the school so my child will too.

If I only put one school on the application they have to give me that school.

If I put the same school 6 times I will have a better thance of getting that school.

More myths!

- If I apply to a school in another borough, their residents will have priority over me.
- It does not matter if my form is late.
- If I don't apply they'll give me a school anyway.
- They have to give me one of the schools on my list of preferences.
- If I put the nearest school in last place because I don't really want it they
 will give it to me anyway.
- I can only apply for schools in my local authority.
- I live nearer to the school than a child offered a place last year so I'll get a place.

Timeline for Secondary Transfer

- 1st September
 Online applications open
- By end October
 Visits to Secondary schools' open evenings
 - Parents advised of selective tests outcome
- 31st October
 Closing date for applications
- 1st March
 Offer day/outcome. Online applicants receive email
- 15th March
 Acceptance of school offer deadline accept online
- Mar-Sep 2022
 Further offers from waiting lists
- April July
 Appeals take place
