- Tried and tested over many years

What is phonics?



Phonics: To blend sounds together to make words.

Sounds: All words are made of individual sounds and these sounds are merged together to form a word e.g. 'mat'.

Graphemes: Is another name for the letters we use to write the sounds (the spelling of the sounds).



How Does RWI Work?



Children:

- Learn 44 sounds
- 26 letters
- Over 150+ graphemes (letter combinations)
- Learn to blend sounds to read words
- Read from a range of storybooks and non-fiction books matched to their phonic knowledge
- One of the most complex alphabetic codes in the world.

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Fred Talk Sounds + blending = reading

• Fred helps children learn to read

Fred can only talk in sounds...

(Fred can only say c -a-t, he can't say cat)
 We call this Fred Talk

 If children understand Fred, they can blend orally

Blending is needed for reading







Fred helps children learn to spell as well!
 Children convert words into sounds



They pinch the sounds they hear on to their fingers...

We call this 'Fred Fingers'

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Technical vocabulary

Green Words – words that can be sounded out using our phonics Red words – words that cannot be sounded out or words that have tricky parts e.g. I, said, they Fred Talk – (Fred is the frog) he can only talk in sounds e.g. sh-o-p Special Friends – two or more letters that sit next to each other to make a single sound e.g. air in fair.





Read Write Inc. Online Library

At Bowes we use their online library platform so that children can access their weekly RWI book at home in order to consolidate their learning.



They are a great tool to help your child blend and segment words.

To complement the RWI online books, children also take home 'real books' every week from our class libraries. We value the importance holding reading books for please.



What does RWI look like at Bowes?



- Children in Years 1 and 2 are spilt into phonics groups based on their phonic knowledge.
- Children have daily 40 minutes phonics sessions four times a week.
- Children revisit and review sounds.
- Children are taught to read by breaking down the words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'.
- They are taught how to blend and segment using Fred talk and Fred fingers.
- Children are assessed every half term and groups are fluid.
- Currently, we are carrying out extra phonic sessions per day for some children in order to support them in year 1 and 2 'to keep up'.



How well do children do at Bowes?

Last year, 92% of our children passed the Phonics Screening Check in Year 1.





Phonics Screening Check

- This takes place once a year for Year 1 children in June
- The check is a mixture of alien and real words, 40 in total
- The test takes approximately 4 to 9 minutes to complete
- The children are tested on their set 1, 2 and 3 sounds with real words and nonsense words
- The children will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sound together e.g. d-o-g dog.
- The pass mark has been 32 out of 40 however, the Government can change this and we are not given this information until the results are published.

How can you help?



- Encourage your child to 'sound out' words when reading and writing. Say 'Fred talk'
- Focusing particularly on **spotting 'special friends'**
- Diagraph 2 letters making one sound snail
- Trigraphs 3 letters making one sound night
- Split digraphs 2 vowels with a consonant in between spoke



How can you help?



- You can read stories with your child.
- Read favourite stories **over** and **over** again.
- Read some stories at a higher level than they can read themselves.
- Listen to them reading their **RWI online book**.
- Ask them questions about what you or they have read.
