Writing	Learning Focus - Thinking bubbles and vocabulary work Learn – First fill in the thinking bubbles about the Rhiswanozebtah information text. In the table you find some words from the text and their definitions. Practise – Show that you understand the meaning of the new words by ticking/filling in the empty boxes Review – Check against the meanings in the table. Did you choose the right word? Can you explain to your parents what the words mean? How would you use it in a sentence?	Learning Focus - Brackets to add information Learn – Look at introduction and examples. Practise – Complete the sentences and then write some of your own. Review – Is the added information useful? Have you checked spellings and punctuation?	Learning Focus - Interesting ways to open sentences Learn – Read and complete the examples that show you how to use adverb starters (fronted adverbials) to engage the reader (1) and to add information (2). Practise – Sentence Starter Game: Write your own sentences about one of the subjects listed in the box using the adverb starters we looked at. Review – Do the starters get the reader's attention? Have you spelt the adverb starters correctly?	Learning Focus - Information text about an iguana Learn – Read the 'Appearance' section of the Rhiswanozebtah text. This shows us what the creature looks like. Practise – Rewrite this section so that it gives information about the blue-headed iguana in the picture instead. The writing frame is there to help you.
