Hold conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teacher and peers.</p> <p>Speaking Participate in small group, class and one-to-one discussions, offering their own ideas, using recently introduced vocabulary.</p>

	<p>Understanding of the World</p> <p>Past and Present/ People, Culture and Communities Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their own experiences and what has been read in class.</p> <p>The Natural World Learn about our environment and how to take care of it. Learn about animals from around the world. Discuss similarities and differences between animals.</p>	<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>Building Relationships Form positive attachments to adults and friendships with peers</p> <p>Self-regulation Show an understanding of their own feelings and those of others, and begin to regulate their behaviour accordingly.</p> <p>Managing self Manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs, including dressing, going to the toilet and understanding the importance of healthy food choices.</p>
